ROSEWOOD KAURI CLIFFS

Perched atop a cliff in the Bay of Islands, this par 72, 18-hole championship **golf course** boasts panoramic views of the Pacific Ocean. After warming up at the world-class practice facilities, golfers of all calibers can enjoy a diverse landscape of forest, farmland and marshes.

Off the green:

 Rosewood's elegant suites and villas all come with ocean views plus there's a spa sanctuary, tennis and pickleball courts, access to three private beaches and a dining room.



FABLE TERRACE DOWNS

Set in the foothills of the Southern Alps, this par 72, 18-hole high country **championship course** is an hour's drive from Christchurch. Scenic and enjoyable for all golfers, warm up at the driving range before hitting the green or sign up for on-site coaching lessons tailored to all skill levels.

Off the green:

 Fable's self-contained villas come with fully equipped kitchens or there's The Clubhouse Restaurant. On-site activities include archery, shooting and all-weather tennis courts.

S OUEENSTOWN



Drive 90 minutes north of Auckland to arrive at Te Arai Links. Two contrasting 18-hole pure links courses – **North** and **South** – are set within an undulating coastal landscape, playable for all abilities. Additional facilities include a two-acre putting green, driving range and short game area.

Off the green:

 Te Arai offers ocean view rooms, cottages and suites plus multiple drinking and dining options and an array of activities including watersports and in-room beauty treatments.



THE KINLOCH CLUB

Tee off at New Zealand's only Jack Nicklaus signature designed course, **The Kinloch Club**. Overlooking Lake Taupō, this par 72, 18-hole championship inland style links course has a reputation for being challenging and stimulating with its undulating fairways and fast greens.

Off the green

 Contemporary luxury suites and residences, estateto-plate fine dining and the Solar Spa are all available on-site at Kinloch Manor, just a two-minute drive from The Kinloch Club.

Home of the New Zealand Open, **Millbrook Resort** has two championship 18-hole alpine links courses set within a natural alpine amphitheater and backdropped by the Remarkables mountain range. Additional facilities include an undercover, heated driving range and putting practice area.
