#### WĒTĀ WORKSHOP EXPERIENCES

New Zealand's capital city Wellington is home to **Wētā Workshop Experiences**, the company that helped bring The Lord of the Rings and The Hobbit movies to life. Join a behind-the-scenes tour or hands-on workshop to explore a world of creativity and learn about the making of movie effects.

#### See it on the big screen:

 While Wētā Workshop Experiences was not a filming location, many of the props and costumes were created here and can be viewed on the tour and seen in the movies.



## **PELORUS ECO ADVENTURES**

On this unique "Hobbit Kayak Tour" you'll paddle down the scenic Pelorus River in Marlborough in an inflatable canoe, visiting remote filming locations from The Hobbit en route. Learn about local history and stop to swim in the crystalclear waters. No previous canoeing experience required.

#### See it on the big screen:

 The Pelorus River was used for the "dwarves floating in giant barrels" scene from The Hobbit: The Desolation of Smaug, the second movie in the trilogy.

## **NOMAD SAFARIS**

Combine off-roading adventure with scenic filming locations from The Lord of the Rings movie trilogy on this guided tour with **Nomad Safaris** based in Queenstown. Running year-round, choose from half and full-day tours to several key locations – optional costume dress up included.

## See it on the big screen:

 Visit several filming locations including Deer Park Heights in Queenstown (Warg riders battle scene) and Paradise in Glenorchy, which became the elven Forest of Lothlórien.
