TRAVEL TO AOTEAROA NEW ZEALAND

Aotearoa New Zealand's borders are open with no Covid-19 restrictions for entry into the motu (country)



VISA & ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Passports must be valid for at least three months beyond your departure date from New Zealand. Your home country passport requirements may differ; please check with your local immigration office prior to travel.

Australian citizens do not need a visitor visa to enter Aotearoa New Zealand.

Australian permanent residents and travellers from a visa waiver country must apply for a New Zealand Electronic Authority (NZeTA).

All other travellers must apply for a visitor visa. These are valid for up to nine months, and the easiest way to apply is online. Travellers are advised not to book travel until their visa has been approved.

All travellers transiting through New Zealand must apply for a Transit Visa, except if you are travelling to Australia, from a visa waiver country or from a transit visa waiver country.

NZeTA

Apply for an NZeTA before travelling to Aotearoa New Zealand.

Apply for an NZeTA if transiting through Auckland International Airport to/from Australia OR another country (if you are from a visa waiver or transit visa waiver country).

Allow up to 72 hours for processing. Check your application status online.

If travelling by cruise, you must have an NZeTA before joining your cruise.

An NZeTA request costs NZD \$17 on the free app, or NZD \$23 if completed online.

You will pay an International Visitor Conservation and Tourism Levy (IVL) at the same time as your NZeTA (NZD \$35).



Complete a Passenger Arrival Card before passing through Customs Passport Control.

If you have a biometric ordinary passport (or electronic passport) and are over 12 years old, you may be able to use the New Zealand Customs e-Gate service.

You will receive free rapid antigen tests (RAT) on arrival at the airport and visitors are encouraged to test for Covid-19 on days o/1 and 5/6. There is a 7-day isolation period (counted from first symptoms) for anyone who tests positive. For full details, visit the Covid-19 website.

Masks are no longer required to be worn in New Zealand except when visiting healthcare services. For full details, visit the Covid-19 website.
